Exemplary High School Student Athletes Reach Educational Goals with Support from Reliant, Houston Texans

HOUSTON, TX; November 15, 2011—Hard work in the classroom, on the playing field and in their communities has earned recognition for eight Houston area high school student-athletes for their academic and athletic achievements, leadership skills and community service. Each recipient received a surprise visit from Houston Texans Ambassador J.J. Moses at their school and was presented with a \$5,000 check in front of their peers. In addition, scholarship recipients will be invited to participate in a pregame, on-field recognition ceremony at the Dec. 4 Texans home game against the Atlanta Falcons. The Houston Texans began play in 2002 as the 32nd franchise to join the National Football League. The franchise was awarded to team founder, chairman and CEO Robert C. McNair on October 6, 1999. The Texans played their first regular-season game on September 8, 2002 and became the first expansion team in NFL history to win its debut game, defeating the Dallas Cowboys 19-10.
