## NRG Energy Gives \$150,000 to Aid with Oil Spill Recovery – Nonprofit Leaders Provide Progress Update

**BATON ROUGE, LA; November 19, 2010**— The Louisiana Disaster Recovery Foundation (LDRF) and its grantees were the designated beneficiaries of NRG Energy, Inc.'s (NYSE: NRG) most recent charitable fundraising effort. The corporation, based in Princeton New Jersey, used its annual company picnic to raise money for charity, as it has done for the past six years. The Company raised a total of \$150,000 in donations from employees (including a dollar-for-dollar Company match) and business associates at this year's picnic in New Jersey.

BP oil disaster. It is going to take the public, private, and non-profit sectors' joint efforts to make the Gulf region whole once again. This new contribution will go a long way in supporting our fishermen and coastal communities which are so vital to our economy, culture, and way of life."

Flozell Daniels, Jr., President and CEO of LDRF, stated that, "LDRF is proud to partner with NRG Energy to support our coastal communities as they work to recover from the BP drilling disaster. NRG Energy is exemplary of the kind of business Louisiana wants to attract: environmentally, economically and socially responsible. On behalf of the many communities that will benefit from this generous gift, LDRF extends its warmest gratitude. We hope that other corporations doing business in Louisiana will follow NRG's lead in giving back."

Leadership from Global Green, Second Harvest, BISCO (Bayou Interfaith Shared Community Organizing), United Houma Nation, Catholic Charities New Orleans Diocese, Mary Queen of Vietnam Community Development Corporation, Southern Mutual Help Association, and the Louisiana Justice Institute were present.
