



NRG Leaders Receive Houston Business Journal Top Honors in Energy

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– John Ragan and Elizabeth Killinger Included in 2013 Who's Who in Energy –

Over the last four years, Reliant has consistently been recognized by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT) on the Power to Choose site, for customer service.

"NRG is positioning Texas for a future in which customers will have even more energy choices, and I'm looking forward to helping lead the state in a strong and stable future."

She serves on the executive committee and board of directors for the Greater Houston Partnership and the boards of directors for the Center for Hearing and Speech in Houston and the March of Dimes Houston Division. Additionally, March of Dimes Houston recently announced Killinger as chair of the 2014 March of Dimes' March for Babies.
