**Exemplary High School Student Athletes Receive Scholarships from Reliant Energy
Company Has Awarded More than \$100,000 in Scholarships to Houston-area
Students Since 2006**

HOUSTON – The future looks brighter for eight Houston-area high school student-athletes thanks to Reliant Energy and the Houston Texans.
