Those who sign up for the Degrees of Difference with Nest program get access to two exclusive, new Nest features: Rush Hour Rewards and Seasonal Savings. Rush Hour Rewards automatically tweaks temperatures around each energy rush hour to help customers earn greater bill credits. Seasonal Savings takes everything Nest has learned about the customer and their habits and looks for new opportunities to save energy.

"Customers help their budgets and our communities manage electricity needs by using a little less electricity when it counts," said Elizabeth Killinger, President of Reliant. "The Degrees of Difference programs make it easy for customers to join Texans across the state to help conserve electricity during periods of high electricity demand expected this summer."

Results from a pilot program conducted last summer showed a reduction of electricity consumption by about 33 percent from active participants. Reliant estimates if 325,000 residential customers reduce their usage by 33 percent in a single high-demand period, there would be enough capacity added to the grid to power an additional 100,000 homes.

Customers signing up for the Degrees of Difference with Nest program must have a Nest thermostat and an active Nest account. Any Reliant customer with a smart meter can sign up for the Degrees of Difference program, regardless of the electricity plan they are currently using. The resulting bill credits will appear within one to two billing cycles.
