Each recipient received a surprise visit from Houston Texans Ambassador J.J. Moses at his or her school this fall and was presented with a \$5,000 check in front of their classmates. In addition, scholarship recipients were given the opportunity to participate in a pre-game, on-field presentation at a Texans home game.

Since the inception of the Scholarship for Champions program in 2006, 32 Houston-area high school student athletes have been awarded scholarships.
